Following her celebrated monograph *Blue Violet* (2021), *Emerald Drifters* is the widely anticipated new book from photographer and writer Cig Harvey. Focusing on the ephemeral nature of light, pigment, and vision, Harvey continues her exquisite personal study of sensory experience.

In *Emerald Drifters*, Harvey's latest photographs are lush tableaux of her signature subjects—flora, cakes, domestic interiors, and the human figure in landscape— accompanied by prose vignettes on the science and art of color, written in a vibrant, intimate style. The book opens with Harvey's own introductory 'manifesto,' touching on her relationship to sight and time, specifically as they relate to color. The following pages feature rich images, drawings, and writing in a variety of forms—personal essays of varying lengths; instructions on activities such as 'How to Make a Cake,' contributed by Harvey's daughter; and large format declarative texts that jump off the page: 'Life is the awe and the agony, the brutal and the beautiful.'

In addition to Harvey's evocative texts woven throughout the pages, *New York Times*-bestselling author Ocean Vuong contributed an insightful afterword which shines a new light on her work. Bound in a vivid silkscreened cloth case with colorful end papers, *Emerald Drifters* is a one-of-a-kind, vibrant catalog of pleasures and heartbreaks, and, as Harvey writes, "an urgent call to live."






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
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About the Authors
